Clizabeth Bergeron, pilgrim of Hope!

In this Jubilee Year 2025, Pope Francis has invited us to become pilgrims of Hope in our world. Therefore, I feel called to seek and to find traces of Hope in the life of our Venerable Foundress, Elizabeth Bergeron (*Mother St. Joseph*). Of course, Elizabeth is a pilgrim of Hope. I have looked through the life of our foundress to discover the fruits that a heart anchored in Hope gives. Here are some fruits: patience, humility, joy, courage, audacity, gratitude, trust, serenity and letting go give meaning to the word: "Hope".

For Elizabeth, audacity and courage gave wings to Hope. When she presented herself for the first time at Bishop Moreau's house, the turn of this visit was not a success, far from it! This is what you can read in the book of Yvon Langlois, Élisabeth, parfum d'étoile [Élizabeth, a Scent of Star], on pages 53 to 55. Despite everything, she dared to ask for a second meeting with the bishop of St. Hyacinthe, Monsignor Moreau. Her perseverance gave the bishop the opportunity to tell her about a project of which he dreamed. He invites her to pray to the Holy Spirit with him. It was then that she became the "cornerstone" of a community of teaching sisters; she who did not have the necessary education. On her third visit, she said: "Your Grace, here I am. If you believe that I can respond to your goals despite my ignorance and my incompetencies, I am at your disposal." In September 1877, her humble and grateful heart gave birth to a community of women teachers. "Obedience based on humility is what keeps religious life fervent and makes those who practice it happy," says Elizabeth.

The three theological virtues, Faith, Hope and Charity, walk hand in hand and the life of our Sister Elizabeth is all impregnated with them. Her journey as a pilgrim of Hope began at the age of 8, when she asked the parish priest to live her first communion. Audacious Elizabeth! Then, at the age of 14, when she knocked on the door of a first religious community before leaving for the United States, she was advised to follow her family, she was too young. When she returned to Quebec, objections were raised. Among other things, her health was too fragile to live this or that religious lifestyle. This is probably why one day she encouraged her sisters by telling them: "Talk to God about it and He will arrange everything." Her hope led her to trust in the goodness of God. He is the One who arranges everything in his own time. A Faith that takes the path of patience is a Faith on the move and this is called Hope.

What can I say about her grateful heart! It opens a door to Hope. "Oh! Let us love God! He has so much solicitude for us! Let us prove our gratitude to Him by doing His will." This other word with which she encourages a novice: "My little sister, in our religious life, you will encounter obstacles, sorrows, annoyances; do not be discouraged. Arm yourself with the shield of Faith, go to the Blessed Sacrament

and entrust all this to Him and you will leave Him, happy with your visit. She continues: "The Eucharist is the most effective stimulus that allows us to face all difficulties." These words are still relevant today, regardless of our profession or our vocation.

Her free heart opens in the face of illness and death, she dares to say: "Tomorrow is the feast of our good Father St. Joseph, may he come and fetch me, if God wants it." Even though she was eager to go and see God, she did not die on March 19, but on April 29, 1936, and it was testified that she abandoned herself to God and that she was serene in the face of death. To note, this year we celebrate the 89th anniversary of her new birth in the heart of God, this God of our Hope.

In the face of the political, economic, social and personal situations we are experiencing today, our dear Mother Elizabeth invites us to this message of Hope: "Let us pray together... May the Holy Spirit shed light on the situation and inspire the solution. I am going to pray for the light to come out. »
